DAY 1 BRISBANE – DEVONPORT BD

Friday, 18th November: Passengers fly from Brisbane to Melbourne today. Details for your airport transfer will be detailed on your personal itinerary. A free day in Melbourne for passengers travelling to Tasmania. Late afternoon board the Spirit of Tasmania for overnight transfer to Devonport. Tonight enjoy dinner at the Captain's table. Accommodation: Spirit of Tasmania, twin share cabin

DAY 2 TAMAR VALLEY SIGHTSEEING LD

Saturday, 19th November: Enjoy breakfast aboard ship this morning (own expense) before disembarking at approximately 7.30am at the Devonport Terminal. Make our way to Beauty Point for a guided tour of Seahorse World. Next, visit the amazing Platypus House for a guided tour of the Platypus ponds to watch them feed and play. Enjoy a delicious lunch at the Cormorant Café on the Pier, followed by a visit to the Beaconsfield Mine & Heritage Centre. Stop in for a visit to the Swiss village of Grindlewald before arriving at our motel. Two night stay Hotel Grand Chancellor

DAY 3 LAUNCESTON SIGHTSEEING BMLD

Sunday, 20th November: Start our day with some free time to explore beautiful Cataract Gorge, then visit the historic mansion Woolmers Estate for morning tea and a tour. After lunch and some free time at the City Park it's onto Boags Brewery for an informative tour of the facilities then, for the beer lovers and 'educational' tasting session.

DAY 4 LAUNCESTON – BICHENO BMLD

Monday, 21st November: A delightful day of sightseeing today as we head north to Low Head to explore the historic Low Head Pilot Station. Next, visit Bridestowe Lavender Farm for lunch and a guided farm tour. Head east to Legerwood to view the Carved Memorial Trees. The 25 statues depict the fallen men for whom the trees were planted in 1918. The trees were deemed no longer

safe in 2001 and in 2004, it was decided that each stump would be carved into the likeness of each soldier. Travel through the lush myrtle rainforest at Weldborough Pass through St Helens and onto Bicheno. Two night stay Beachfront at Bicheno

DAY 5 WINEGLASS BAY CRUISE BLD

Tuesday, 22nd November: This morning, experience the exquisite beauty of the magnificent Freycinet Peninsula with WINEGLASS BAY CRUISES. Wineglass Bay, nestled underneath the Hazards Mountain range, is a location of primeval peace and beauty. DAY 6 BICHENO – PORT ARTHUR BMD

Wednesday, 23rd November: Travel through Swansea for a photo stop at the amazing Spiky Bridge. The bridge was built by convicts in 1843 using thousands of local fieldstones. Onto Port Arthur for a visit to the Port Arthur Historic Site. Enjoy a fascinating guided walk of Port Arthur's infamous convicts' prison and historic site and a cruise around the Isle of the Dead. Visit the Port Arthur Gallery, which includes interactive exhibits and displays and enjoy access to more than 30 historic buildings, restored houses, heritage gardens and walking trails. Stay Fox & Hound Hotel

DAY 7 PORT ARTHUR – HOBART BMD

Thursday, 24th November: Farewelling Port Arthur, spend some time exploring. Places of interest include Tasman Arch, Devil's Kitchen and Tessellated Pavement. Continue onto charming Richmond and spend some time exploring this heritage town. On arrival in Hobart, time and weather permitting ascend Mt Wellington for a spectacular view of Hobart and surrounds before making our way to our accommodation. Stay Hotel Grand Chancellor Hobart

DAY 8 HOBART – STRAHAN BLD

Friday, 25th November: Discover the magic of Russell Falls, the jewel in the crown of Mt Field National Park. Next, continue to the pristine World Heritage-Listed Cradle Mountain-Lake St Clair National Park. Visit the Wall in The Wilderness. Take a walk to view magnificent Nelson Falls before travelling through the mining town of Queenstown then Strahan. Two night stay Strahan Village Hilltop

DAY 9 GORDON RIVER CRUISE BLD

Saturday, 26th November: This morning join World Heritage Cruises for a memorable GORDON RIVER CRUISE where the wilderness comes to the water's edge. You'll be awestruck by the beauty of the dark waters, stained amber by buttongrass tannins, reflecting the untouched wilderness. We stop at SARAH ISLAND and discover the ruins of the brutal penal colony. See Hell's Gate and Heritage Landing, site of the 2,000 year old Huon Pine.

DAY 10 STRAHAN – CRADLE MOUNTAIN BLD

Sunday, 27th November: As we board the West Coast Wilderness Railway this morning we step back in time, travelling deep into the heritage of the Tasmanian wilderness. Listening to the live on-board commentary on this majestic steam train, we hear tales of resilience and triumph over rugged terrain, hardship and adversity. Our journey takes us through historic stations, traversing deep into the chasm of the King River Gorge. We'll see the places where early west coast pioneers lived and worked to create this extraordinary railway. After returning to Strahan we board the coach and travel to the alpine woodland of Cradle Mountain. Stay Cradle Mountain Hotel

DAY 11 CRADLE MOUNTAIN – SMITHTON BLD

Monday, 28th November: This morning we join a guided tour, walking through the myrtles and King Billy pines at Cradle Valley to Gustav Weindorfer's Chalet. Gain an insight into the early history of

the Cradle Mountain area and the people who played a pivotal role in the establishment of the National Park. View picturesque Dove Lake before we depart for the historic village of Stanley, originally established as the headquarters of the Van Diemen's Land Company. Take a chairlift ride to the top of The Nut, the core of an ancient volcano, before checking-in at our hotel. Stay Tall Timbers Hotel

DAY 12 SMITHTON – CAPE GRIM – LAUNCESTON BMLD

Tuesday, 29th November: Travel to Woolnorth where we visit Roaring 40's Windfarm. Hear about this exciting part of Woolnorth's ever-changing landscape and stand on the impressive west coast at the viewing gallery. From the windfarm we head on to CAPE GRIM which is also on the rugged west coast and has spectacular scenery and where you can breathe the cleanest air in the World. After lunch travel east along the coast through Penguin and Ulverstone to Launceston. Stay Hotel Grand Chancellor Launceston

DAY 13 LAUNCESTON – MELBOURNE BM

Wednesday, 30th November: Travel west along the Bass Highway to MOLE CREEK CAVES for a tour of Marakoopa Cave. On our Underground Rivers and Glow-worms Tour be dazzled by the caves' sparkling crystals, reflection pools, stalactites and stalagmites. Listen to the music of the underground streams and soak up the silence of abandoned river passages. Leaving the caves, we head to TROWUNNA WILDLIFE PARK for a guided tour which includes Devil feeding. Next, head to SHEFFIELD, 'THE TOWN OF MURALS' for some free time to purchase lunch and check out the delightful murals, then on to Latrobe's HOUSE OF ANVERS for chocolate tasting. Sadly, our time on the Apple Isle is almost at an end as we make our way to Devonport ready to board the 'Spirit of Tasmania' for our return to Melbourne. Dinner tonight is at your own expense.

DAY 14 MELBOURNE – WEST WYALONG MLD

Thursday, 1st December: Enjoy breakfast aboard the ship this morning (own expense) before disembarking at approximately 7.30am at the Port of Melbourne. After disembarking, make our way north to Shepparton where we pause for morning tea then on to Jerilderie for lunch at the Royal Mail Hotel. This iconic hotel was once targeted and raided by the Kelly Gang. After lunch, continue north along the Newell Highway to West Wyalong. Stay Club Inn Resort.

DAY 15 WEST WYALONG – MOREE BMD

Friday, 2nd December: Resume our journey along the Newell Highway through Forbes and Parkes to Dubbo where we pause for lunch (own expense). Continue onto Moree for our last night together. Stay Burke & Wills Motor Inn.

DAY 16 MOREE – HOME BM

Saturday, 3rd December: All too soon we are back in familiar territory with arrival in Brisbane mid-afternoon. Northbound passengers stay on board for arrival into the Wide Bay early evening.
